The paintings represent the golden period of Indian art. These temples of Ajanta are situated in the district of Aurangabad in Maharashtra. twenty -nine of these thirty caves are complete. The thirtieth cave is very small and incomplete – some scenes of Buddha's life are inscribed here and some statues of Buddha have been found in this cave.

The subjects of these paintings are varied. Different aspects of life have been captured in colour. Lonely village life, the life of luxury and comfort of the cities, as also the lives of beggars, fishermen, soldiers in action, hunters and many other subjects constitute their specialities. Scenes of religious and philosophical life have been depicted in the background of these figures. Human emotions like love, shyness, fear, anger and beauty have been nicely illustrated. The roofs of the Ajanta caves are artistically adorned with paintings of animals, birds, gods and goddesses. In spite of their limited means, the artists worked with such skill and perfection that even today we are fascinated by the rhythm and balance of the ornamentation.
