## SECTION A – READING (20 Mark)

## 1. Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow: (8 Marks)

1. Tourism has emerged as the world's largest industry. Growing rapidly in the last two decades, today it accounts for 6% of world output and employs some 100 million people around the globe. Since the end of the Second World War, it has developed immense revenue and development potential and stands today as a unique natural renewable resource industry.

2. Tourism-the travel based recreation provides people with a change of visiting a place and a breaking from the monotony of daily life. It brings people of different nations together, allowing them to come into close contact with each other's customs and other aspects of life. It reveals the scenic beauty and past heritage of a country to people belonging to other nations. The knowledge and experience gained in the process can lead to greater understanding and tolerance and can even foster world peace.

3. The contribution of tourism can nowhere be seen more clearly than on the economic front. A study conducted by the United Nations has shown that developing countries, in particular, can reap handsome benefits out of tourism which greatly boosts national income.

4. Tourism generates employment and adds to the entrepreneurial wealth of nation. While tourism's advantages are many, its undesirable side-effects have raised fresh problems.

5. Tourism can cause social, cultural or environmental disruption. One of the greatest concern is its damage to the environment. In order to attract more tourist, sprawling resorts are built which take neither the local architectural styles nor the ecology into consideration. Natural systems come to be destroyed as a result of indiscriminate construction to provide water and waste disposal facilities and recreational arrangements to tourists. Over use of environmental wealth disturbs the ecological balance.

6. Damage is most in wildlife parks which remain the foremost sites of tourist attraction. Tourist vans and the visitor's feet destroy the ground vegetation thus affecting the feeding habits of the animals and landscape as well. Overcrowding brings about congestion, leading to environmental and health hazards.

7. The Taj Mahal, one of the seven wonders of the world, has suffered a lot of wear and tear from trampling feet of tourists.

8. Some Socio-cultural effect of tourism have been damaging. Tourism often ushers in new life styles, arrangements as desired by tourists are provided in order to them feel at home. The emergence of the 'other' culture in various places has caused dissatisfaction among the local people. The concern is that the local people tend to imitate the foreign values, breaking away from their own traditions.

9. To promote safe tourism while ensuring that it remains a profitable industry, it is imperative to understand the factors that hamper the growth of tourism and check them effectively.

10. General instability of the nation is damaging to tourism prospects. Political disturbances, in particular, pose a serious problem. The growing violence in the international scene and increasing threat of terrorism affects the flow of tourists. Countries like Sri Lanka have been a victim to terrorist threats for long and have therefore suffered set-backs in tourism.

#### 2. Read the following passage carefully:

Did you know that most us have a few cancer cells floating around in our bodies at some point of time or the other? They keep a lookout for a weak spot where they can begin their destruction. Our defence system begins to produce antibodies to destroy them. But the moment this mechanism weakens, the cancer cells multiply rapidly and damage major body organs.

If you've been eating sensibly, you may get rid of these cancer causing cells and not even know that your body had them. Scientists say that the difference between those who don't get cancer and those who do, is a strong immune system fortified with correct food habits, intake of adequate vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. The immune system doesn't work well in anyone who is under nourished.

Cancer has always been a threat to our health for a long time, and its incidence has increased in the industrial era, coinciding with our increasingly toxic environment. The reasons, it has been found, range from genetics to life style, environment, and toxins. Of the five million registered chemicals in the world, we encounter 70,000 of them on regular basis. Of those atleast 20,000 are carcinogenic (cancer causing).

As we grow older we get exposed to toxins, in the food that we eat, the water we drink, and the air we breathe. Each of the 60 trillion cells in our body faces atleast thousand 'hits' or carcinogen attacks every day. We wallow in our own hi-tech wastes of industrial pollutants, electromagnetic radiation, environmental toxins, chemicals, insects sprays, agricultural pollutants, alcohol, tobacco, drugs, mental stress and internal toxins, all of which weaken our immunity.

The human body is built from food and is also repaired by your diet. Nutritional therapy tries to re-establish 'balance' in the body by helping it to detoxify, correct its pH balance (acid based balance), build resistance and provide nourishment to enable it fight the regular toxins that it ingests. If you are eating reasonably, a standard multi vitamin pill will be sufficient.

Stress, say from work pressures causes your immune system to shut down. It is important to know that cancer cannot invade a healthy body. Keeping your body's defence mechanism in good shape is the only way to fight those terrorists within.


