The Kohinoor originated in Andhra Pradesh along with another diamond called the 'Darya-ye Noor'- the 'Sea of Light.' It was found in the Kollur region of Guntur district, one of the world's earliest diamond- producing regions. This region was the only known source of diamonds until 1730. Later, diamonds were discovered in Brazil.
