Rainforests are home to several species of plants and animals and are rich in natural resources. There is water everywhere in the rainforest. The forest absorbs the heavy and frequent rain like a giant sponge. Then it slowly releases the water in the form of little streams and rivulets that wind their way along until they eventually join the mighty River Amazon. In fact, there is a web-like network of these streams flowing through the thick forest.

One should be careful while wading through the water, as many kinds of fishes live here. One such fish is the stingray. It is a flat fish that lies buried in the sand in stream beds and uses the sting in its long whip-like tail to hit and paralyse its prey. It also uses this as a defence when someone is about to step on it. Most of these streams have several types of trees lining their banks and even growing in them. Some plants let out natural dyes that often turn the water into a certain coffee colour. You cannot see the bed of the stream through the water, though this water is perfectly clean and good to drink. When you walk through the rainforest, you have to cross several such streams in the course of a day's trek.
